OUTLINE ITINERARY



- Day 1 Arrive at Dudhwa. Game drive into the Reserve. Overnight in Sonaripur FRH within the Tiger Reserve.
- Day 2, 3 & 4 Full day game drive into the Reserve. Wildlife viewing is split between jeeps and elephant back. Overnight in the Sonaripur and Sathiana FRH where we would shift on Day 3 for the next two nights
- Day 5 Morning game drive and then depart after breakfast to your onward destination.

ITINERARY WOULD INCLUDE

- Accommodation at two Forest Rest Houses (FRH) within Dudhwa Tiger Reserve for four nights
- All meals from lunch on Day 1 to breakfast on Day 5, aerated drinks, mineral or filtered drinking water, tea/ coffee
- Three elephant rides (2-hour each) while inside the National Park (subject to availability as it cannot be booked in advance)
- A dedicated jeep with a driver and a naturalist for entire duration of the trip
- All relevant entry fees and permits (charges levied by the forest department are subject to change without prior notice)
- Accompanying chef and other assistants from Camp Forktail Creek for the overnight stay in the Forest Rest House
- A pilot jeep for staff and supplies

EXTRA EXPENSES

Expenses of personal nature such as beverages (except those mentioned above) laundry, telephone calls, internet, souvenirs and tips.

Arrival and departure transfers could be arranged on request.

INFORMATION ON FOOD AND ACCOMMODATION



Dudhwa Tiger Reserve offers stay in a number of old Forest Rest Houses.

Our favourites are **Sonaripur** and **Sathiana**. Both these bungalows are situated in great locations inside the Tiger Reserve and offer excellent wildlife viewing opportunities in the surrounding areas. They are government run and are basic, but functional.

In addition, the team from Camp inspects and readies each room prior to the arrival of our guests. Apart from making sure we have a comfortable stay, the team also takes care of fresh meals right on site!

DETAILED ITINERARY



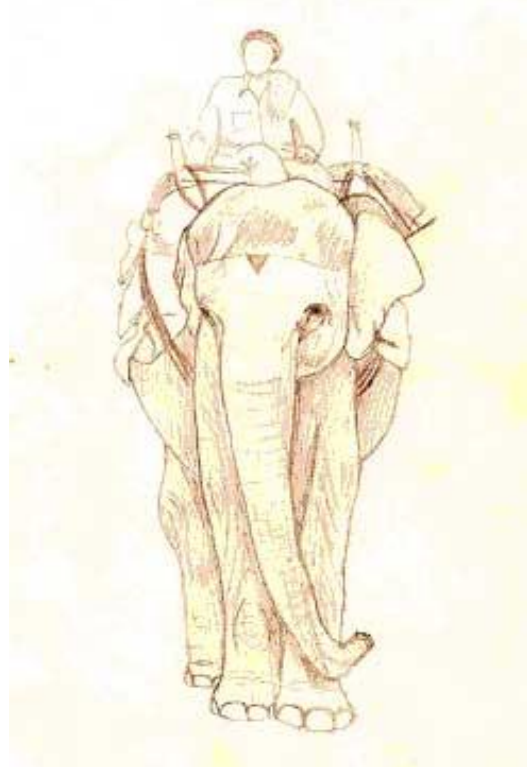
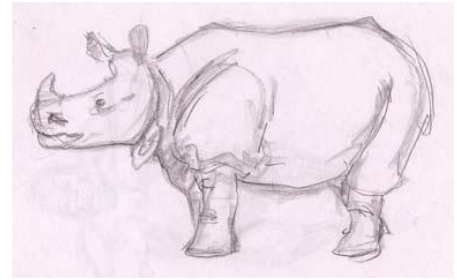
Day 1: Arrive at Dudhwa Tiger Reserve

Whatever time you arrive, we would be there to greet you at the gate of Dudhwa Tiger Reserve. Arrival transfer could also be arranged on request.

Post that, a short drive of 20-30 minutes from the gate to the Forest Rest House (FRH) inside the Reserve (subject to availability).

After a wash and change and a sumptuous

lunch, time permitting, we would go on a game drive and explore the immediate forest. Back to the FRH by evening. Early dinner and then overnight in the FRH.



Day 2, 3 & 4: Full day game viewing inside Dudhwa Tiger Reserve

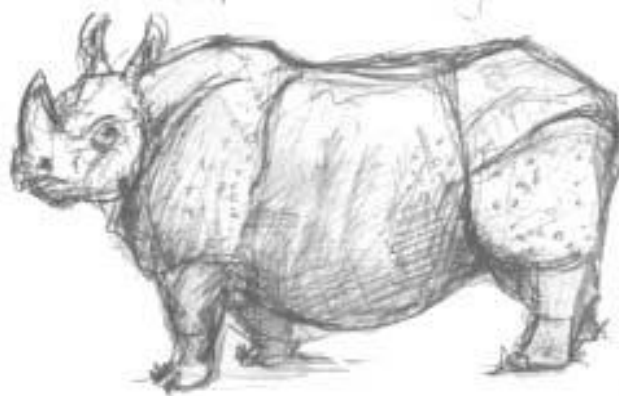
Three full days of wildlife viewing inside the Tiger Reserve.

Viewing would be split between elephant back (subject to availability) and game drives in open jeeps.

We would visit the Rhino enclosure area, the grasslands, lakes, the watchtowers and drive on the long lonely roads of Dudhwa.

Meals would be either packed (depending on where we are headed for the day) or served in the FRH by our crew from Camp.

Our first two nights would be in Sonaripur FRH and the next two in Sathyana FRH inside the Tiger Reserve.



Day 4: Depart for onward journey

A game drive in the morning and then breakfast at the FRH, after which you bid farewell to your hosts and guide and depart for your onward journey.

Departure transfer from the gate of Dudhwa Tiger Reserve could be arranged on request.
